#### **Introduction to the Day**

Our baptismal covenant draws us to God's heart through Christ and draws God's love and truth into our hearts. delight in your will and walk in your ways, to the glory of your holy name.



Christ did not glorify himself in becoming a high priest, but was appointed by the one who said to him,

"You are my Son,

as he says also in another place,


"You are a priest forever,

Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. Those who love their life lose it, and those who hate their life in this world will keep it for eternal life. Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there will my servant be also. Whoever serves me, the Father will honor.

"Now my soul is troubled. And what should I say—'Father, save me from this hour'? No, it is for this reason that I have come to this hour. Father, glorify your name."
