A Message from the Pastor

New Beginnings

Backpacks have been purchased, teachers assigned, and extracurricular commitments sketched into the calendar. Whether or not you are a student, it seems as though our life together is always marked by the beginning of the new school year. For most, it's a time to look forward with hope and excitement for what the year ahead will bring. But new beginnings exist only because something is ending. Summer rest is now a thing of the past. The classroom you loved last year or the schedule your children – and grandchildren – maintained several months ago simply will not be the same anymore. It is only after a beginning has begun that we start to feel the grief of what was left behind.

How divinely timed it is that I join you in *this season* of transition. Autumn marks not only a new school year, but it also marks the beginning of a new chapter at Ascension Lutheran. I feel your joy and hope for how we might deepen and grow our calling as a community rooted in the gospel. But just as how any transition goes, I also sense the grief for what has ended. By calling a part-time pastor, we are acknowledging how our community has changed.

We are not alone in this tension. God's people have long known and struggled with this liminal space. Scripture, after all, is a story of endings and beginnings. The Old Testament, in particular, is filled with invitations for us to see how God has worked in our past (e.g., Psalm 77) and points us to the future (e.g., Isaiah 43). In the resurrected Christ, we know of a hope which surpasses all our understanding—a faith which continues to plant seeds and sprout new life in the most unlikely places. My prayer is that we might be attentive for how God is at

work in our own lives and especially in our collective life at Ascension Lutheran.

God is indeed planting new seeds. New life is arising.

Alpha and Omega, the First and the Last, the Beginning and the End: We give great thanks that you are with us in every season of our lives. Bless this new school year and this new beginning at Ascension Lutheran. Strengthened by the Holy Spirit, help us to lean on one another in our sorrows and encourage one another in the new life happening among us. Awaken us with your joy, ground us in your promises, and renew us in our shared ministry together, in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, Amen.

Caring for Friends Snack Bags



Caring for Friends provides food

and friendship to homebound seniors, veterans, homeless persons and families with children in need. They provide ready-to-heat meals, caring visits and cards, and fresh/pantry staple food items that support hunger relief in the five counties of Greater Philadelphia. They need about 4,000 snack bags a day to serve hungry children and adults in between meals and for breakfast.

On May 21 we filled 670 Snack/Breakfast bags thanks to your generosity and a Thrivent Action Team grant. **We will be assembling Snack bags again on September 10**, God's Work Our Hands Sunday. A Thrivent Action team grant has been received. Your help is greatly appreciated!

Caring for Friends is no longer requesting oatmeal, instant coffee/tea/hot chocolate packs as they are transitioning to Snack Bags only.

Items needed:

1 gallon plastic storage bags (zip loc)

6.75 oz 100% juice boxes (especially needed)

Cereal/granola/protein bars (Snack bags)

6 packs of peanut butter or cheese crackers

1 oz boxes of raisins or other dried fruit, or fruit/vegetable squeeze pouches (such as Motts or GoGoSqueeze)

Or cash donations are also welcome.

Our goal is 750 or more snack bags prepared.
